Matthew 5:1-12 January 30, 2011

I'm happy. I am very happy.

Why shouldn't I be happy? I have every reason to be happy! I live in Iowa! Really!

Really. I have every reason to be happy.

I am married to a remarkable woman: loyal, hardworking, fun, always thinking about ways to do things for other people -- for members of her family, for members of her church family, for her UNI colleagues, and for me.

I have two beautiful grandkids right close by and I can spend time with them any time I want!

I love my job. It is interesting, varied, challenging, and rewarding. I am privileged to share with you some of the most meaningful moments of your lives and to talk with you about deep and important matters.

the Kingdom of heaven belongs to them!

I'm in there! I'm one of those people! Jesus was talking to me! And I am almost certain that Jesus was talking to you, too, every one of you. People who do something, anything, to mend broken relationships, to try to bring people together. People who make peace in their own families, and people who make peace in this world.

Happy are those who are persecuted because they do what God requires. People who pay a price for doing the right thing, but do it anyway.
